Minutes of the November 16, 2010 Called Meeting

At 10:50 a.m. Elder Effie Bynum (Moderator-elect serving as Moderator for this meeting in the absence of Moderator Rev. Perry Wootten) called the meeting to order and opened with prayer. There were comments about the travel difficulties which delayed the start of the meeting.

Rev. Herbert C. Oliver rose in protest this specially called meeting of PNYC, stating "this meeting has been called illegally for the following reasons,

1. *It calls for the consideration of postponing the November 16, 2010 meeting while stating in the Call letter that the date could not be changed.*
2. *It calls for the Presbytery not to take specific actions, not as called for by the Book of Order, but "take such actions as may be necessary and critical to preserve the peace unity and purity of the Presbytery."*

With the protest recorded, Moderator Bynum called upon the Stated Clerk, Rev. Cornell Edmonds, to constitute the meeting. **Rev. Edmonds reported a quorum of 25/25/20 (25 minister members and 25 elders, representing no fewer than 20 churches) present and is sufficient for ordinary business, but not for all of the business identified in the Call to this called meeting.**

As a point of order, Rev. Fred Anderson (Pastor Madison Avenue) objected to the higher quorum requirement stating that Constitutional issues are not included in the Call to the meeting. Moderator Bynum responded that her understanding is items a 3 and 4 of the Call require the higher level of quorum. Rev. Anderson stated his disagreement that a higher quorum is required. **Moderator Bynum requested a ruling from Stated Clerk Edmonds** concerning quorum. He requested that the Moderator either read the Call into the record for the body or request a motion dispensing with the reading of the Call. **Moderator Bynum read the business items of the Call into the record as follows:**

- [1] To review and approve the minutes for May 18, 2010 and June 20, 2010;*
- [2] To hear official whether a remedial complaint has been filed by the stated clerk against the Presbytery;*
- [3] To consider postponing the November 16, 2010 stated meeting of the Presbytery [presently scheduled to convene at 1:00pm]; and*
- [4] To take such actions as may be necessary and critical to preserve the peace, unity and purity of the Presbytery.*

Stated Clerk Edmonds addressed the business items of the Call starting with the first item, the approval of minutes, for which he advised Robert's Rules requires approval of minutes, be at the next regular meeting. He added that at the September 25, 2010 meeting, the body acted to recess the meeting to consider the May 18th and June 30th meeting minutes; this action is still in force. Additionally, Robert's Rules does not permit the calling of special meeting for the consideration of minutes.

Stated Clerk Edmonds added the second item of business is for hearing officially if a remedial action has been filed, but there is no basis for this in the Book of Order or in the Presbytery's Standing Rules. While this could be announced as a courtesy and this item is docketed as part of the General Council's report in the Presbytery's Stated Meeting this afternoon. Rev. Edmonds offered to provide copies of the complaint to anyone requesting a copy.

Rev. Edmonds stated the third item of business calls for consideration of postponing the November 16, 2010 Stated Meet of Presbytery. This meeting has been scheduled as directed by our Standing Rules. Postponing the stated meeting would require amending the Standing Rules. Amending the Standing Rules is constitutional business which requires a super-majority quorum.

Furthermore, the Standing Rules require the Presbytery's budget be considered at the November meeting. Postponing the meeting requires amending the Standing Rules, which requires a super-majority quorum. If the budget is not considered at this meeting, it effectively shuts down the Presbytery. Item 3 on the docket is a motion that would shut down the Presbytery in its current form.

The Stated Clerk continued the Moderator's request that he review the suitability of the docket stating item 4 reads: *to take such actions as may be necessary and critical to preserve the peace, unity and purity of the Presbytery* and said that actions relating to the peace, unity and purity of the church are reserved for the disciplinary section of the Book of Order. If there is a desire to take action, this appears to be a suspension of the due process rights of the intended person in the action. Assuming the person is the Stated Clerk, the Stated Clerk is an officer of the Presbytery, not an employee. The same super-majority required to elect the Stated Clerk is required for other items related to election of the Stated Clerk.

Elder Adolfo Griffith, Throop Memorial PC, was recognized by Moderator Bynum and asked when notice of a Special Called Meeting was received. Stated Clerk Edmonds reported that notice was made on November 4, 2010, twelve days ago; at least 10 days notice must be made of a meeting. Elder Griffith commented that the September 25th meeting is a recessed meeting and it is necessary to complete the business of the September meeting first. Elder Griffith stated that the first order of business would be to complete the business of the September meeting, which is called for 1:00 p.m., making this particular meeting out of order.

Moderator Bynum stated her understanding of Elder Griffith's objection, however, this meeting was properly called, so the matter at hand is to consider what of the business in the Call will be undertaken at this meeting. She stated that two of the agenda items cannot be addressed at this meeting, but she hopes the other two matters can be quickly addressed so we are prepared for the 1:00 p.m. stated meeting.

Elder Sharon Davison, Madison Avenue PC, one of the requesters for the special called meeting, said that she does not know when the Stated Clerk became aware of the request for this meeting, but the actual request was sent to the Moderator in October, with a request that the meeting be held before November 9, 2010. When sent, this request had more than 10 days notice period. She said there were misunderstandings and this meeting was not called for earlier than today. While this date and time did not meeting their request for a Called meeting, they decided to not to object with the meeting as called for today.

Concerning the business in the Call, Elder Davison continued, while Robert's Rules does make limits to specially called meetings, the Book of Order, which supersedes Robert's Rules, allows that any business appropriate for a called meeting is also appropriate for a special meeting. With respect to item 3, since the

meeting is already set for today, she thinks that the four persons who called the meeting would be willing to take item 3 off this meetings docket and dispense with it.

With regard to item 4, Elder Davison stated they are not looking to amend the Book of Order. Preserving the peace unity and purity does appear in the Form of Government; it is not only in the Book of Discipline. She also commented that she is not sure why the Clerk thinks item 4 deals with a discipline action. Moderator Bynum requested that Elder Davison provide a reference, other than the Book of Discipline, for preserving the peace unity and purity in all ordination vows. Elder Davison stated this included is in our ordination vows. Moderator Bynum commented that as a general statement she does not understand how this relates to an action for this meeting and requested specifics. Elder Davison stated that it means they want to discuss issues related to the peace, unity and purity of the Presbytery and she" does not think there is anyone in this room that does not think this is a discussion worth having.

Moderator Bynum stated that with no motions on the floor, she is moving forward. The comments of Elder Griffith that the business of this meeting should not occur prior to the conclusion of the September recessed meeting are taken seriously. Moderator Bynum stated the minutes are in the packet for the Stated Meeting scheduled for 1 p.m. today, and the minutes should be considered at that time and ***ruled item 1 "To review and approve the minutes for May 18, 2010 and June 20, 2010" as out of order for this meeting.***

Rev. Andy James, Pastor First PC Whitestone, ***moved that any and all remaining items of business from this called meeting be committed to the January stated meeting of Presbytery to be considered informally under Robert's Rules (§13. §52) as an order of the day during the meeting at time appointed by the Worship and Docket Committee of General Council, with docketed time for such consideration and conversation to be not less than three hours. (These times are to be considered instruction, not guidelines, for shaping the agenda.)***

Further, I move that this informal consideration be led by Richard Blackburn of the Lombard Mennonite Peace Center using the same format currently underway in the presbytery mediation process. The outcomes of any conversation in this informal consideration of these items at the January stated meeting shall be reported out to the presbytery through the broader elements of the problem-solving phase of the mediation process. There was a second to the motion.

Moderator Bynum invited discussion. Rev. James stated that his is a variation on a motion to refer so it cannot be discussed except as to the time and place of referral.

Rev. David Schult, Pastor House of Hope, stated his understanding that the motion cannot be debated, but requested clarification so everyone will understand the intent that the business of the day be consigned to using a process unfamiliar to most people in this Presbytery. He then recalled prior similar experiences in Presbytery that were confusing and not productive

Rev. James stated his disappointment in the limited participation by presbyters, and Presbytery leadership, in the "Mennonite process," but he thinks it would be deeply beneficial to the overall Presbytery. He thinks that some meeting time would be necessary to train presbyters in the process.

Rev. Peggy Thomas, Honorably Retired, asked if in the name of clarification, if the body engaging in debate and requested a ruling on this matter. ***Moderator Bynum ruled that a question to refer is debatable so debate can be heard on the matter.***

Rev. Alistair Drummond, Pastor West End PC, stated that as one of the persons requesting today's special meeting, he thinks that the matters under consideration are urgent and better address in a regular business format.

Elder Linda Spellman, North PC (Queens), spoke against the motion because without a confirmation from Rev. Blackburn to facilitate this meeting; this meeting would held in a very large format; and the Lombard Center has a very structured format that includes both small and large group formats. She thinks it necessary to focus on the matter at hand.

Rev. James responded that he spoke with Rev. Blackburn and he is available and willing. Rev. James stated that he has been advised that five hours would be necessary so the Worship & Docket Committee needs to be aware of the need to schedule accordingly.

Rev. Bob Brashear, Pastor West Park PC, spoke in favor of the motion. He has been participating in the mediation process and is also frustrated by the small participation. He has real frustration that some in the presbytery are seeking to work through the presbytery's deepest issues in a painful process; others continue to seek to address the problems through using ecclesiology and polity. He would like to see the processes brought together and thinks there is no more important work in the Presbytery than this.

Rev. Marcel Welty, Member at Large, spoke to commend his colleague for bringing this motion forward because it captures the spirit of the Mennonite healing process. He does not think the kind of conversation intended by today's called meeting will not be done in parliamentary process, but could be done within the context of the very frank discussion that occurs in the Lombard Mennonite Peace process.

Rev. Diana Austin spoke against the motion stating a great deal of effort was made for getting people to attend today's special meeting. She considers it a dishonor of the effort and time expended to defer the business to another time.

Elder Norman Bumgardner, Redeemer PC of East Brooklyn, stated the motion to refer is debatable, but only on the merits of the motion. He commented that the Synod of the NE has required the Presbytery to have a mediation program and that the Synod has been monitoring the Presbytery. He stated this Presbytery has a habit of being reactive and then needing to clean up the mess we make. He spoke in favor of the motion.

Elder Hope DeRogotis, member of General Council, West Park PC, spoke in favor of motion stating this is a motion that really speaks in favor of really working on the issues peace unity and purity of the presbytery. She thinks this motion gives us a path to get our work done.

Rev. Fred Anderson stated as a point of clarification and correction that the Synod has not required us to do anything. We were not required to enter into a mediation process. Moderator Bynum stated that the Synod of the Northeast recommended the Presbytery engage in mediation.

Elder Mildred McGee, Featherbed Lane PC, stated that the Synod may not have mandated mediation, but the recommendation was clearly as a response to people reporting this Presbytery as disorderly and lacking in spiritual nature. She stated her favor for the motion.

Rev. Jo Cameron spoke in favor of the motion stating there comes a time when we must do things differently. Those who have taken the dedication and time to participate in these programs have been astonished by the possibilities for this Presbytery. "To bring this process into a Presbytery meeting says collectively us to ourselves, there may be a new way that by grace and by our stumbling ways we have been brought to" and she thinks it is time.

Rev. Alistair Drummond requested to speak a second time. He stated he has some strong feelings in support of trying to bring the two ways together, the mediation process and the regular business of Presbytery, but feels strongly that there is something very arbitrary about it. He thinks the question of how to bring the two pieces, the mediation process and the regular business of presbytery, is a separate question. He asked why suspend this particular meeting and not suspend the 1:00 stated meeting or even the whole life of the Presbytery until we are done with the mediation process. He thinks "there is a certain absurdity about debating it in its particular focus on this particular special meeting today. He urged that the question of how to integrate mediation with the business life of the presbytery be placed on the agenda for a regular meeting, but not bring it up in a specially called meeting. He said he feels undermined by this motion to refer.

Elder Lorie Ankersen, First PC of Whitestone, **called the question. There was a second; by vote the motion to call the question was approved.**

Rev. Jane Donnolly, Pastor United PC of Bay Ridge **requested a paper ballot on the main motion to refer.**



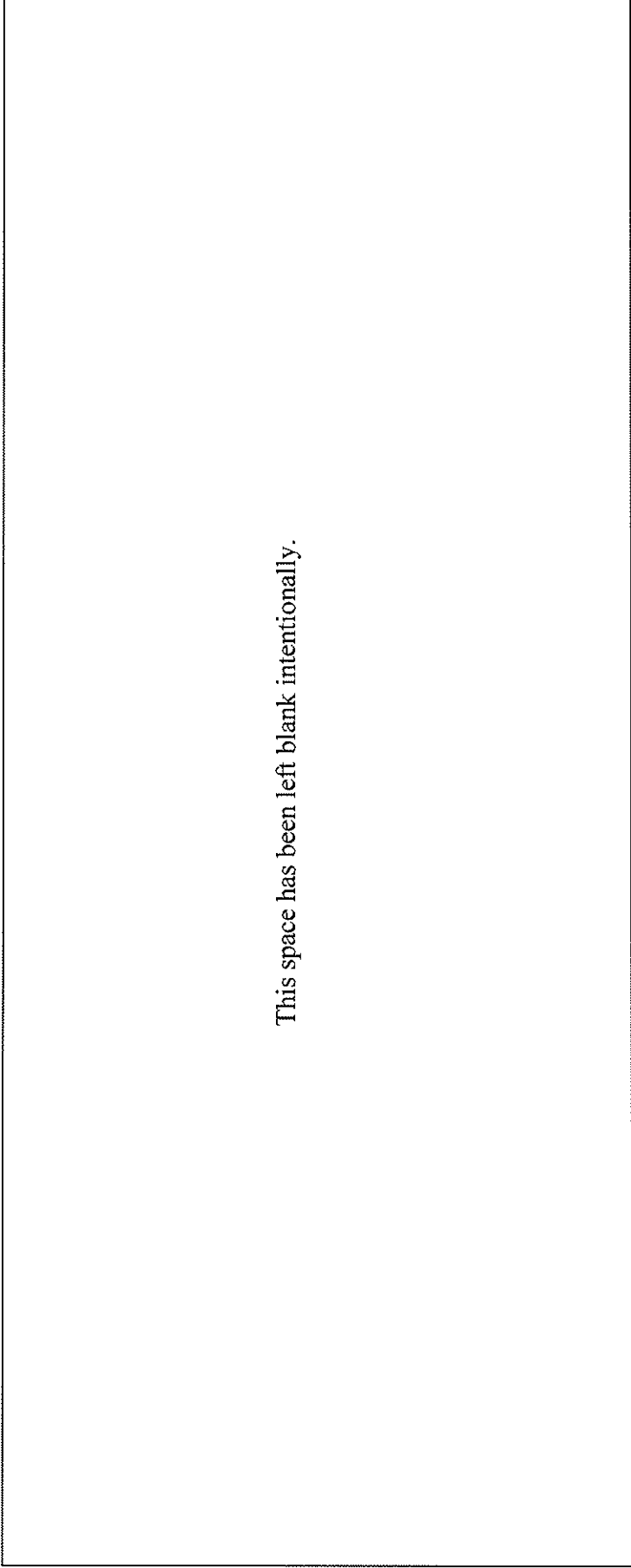
